<p>How can my child be promoted to the next grade level?</p>	<p>Middle School</p> <p>At the end of the school year, the Student Academic Committee, which may include the principal, assistant principal(s), counselor(s), and teacher(s) of the failing subject(s), will review each student's case and make a recommendation. The committee will include parent(s) in the retention discussions before making the recommendation. Final decisions on student promotion or retention are at the discretion of the Executive Director.</p> <p>Students' academic performance, age, emotional and social development, national, state, and local assessment results, overall performance, and teacher recommendation are all considered when making retention decisions. Every effort will be made to work with the student and parents in a timely manner to remediate the student's difficulties before he/she is retained.</p> <p>It is expected that students pass all core classes (Math, ELA, Science, and Social Studies) in order to be promoted to the next grade level, and retention will be considered in the following cases:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Any student failing three (3) or more core classes for an academic year is automatically retained at that grade level. 2. If a student fails one (1) or two (2) core classes, the Student Academic Committee will review the situation on a case by case basis. 3. Any student who has absences, excused or unexcused, of more than twenty (20) days of the required school attendance days may be retained. 4. If a parent requests retention. <p>High School</p> <p>High school students will be promoted to the next grade level upon completion of the designated number of credits. Failure to meet the minimum requirements at the conclusion of the year will result in the student being classified in the same grade level for the next year. 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<p>What is my child learning at school? How can a parent review these materials?</p>	<p>Parents are encouraged to be an active part of their student's educational career. This can begin by attending Open House to learn about curriculum and expectations. Beyond that, BCS offers parents access to an on-line learning management system (LMS; Campus Learning). Campus Learning provides access to upcoming assignments, classroom calendar, reminders of upcoming events, etc. This platform also provides access to student assignments and classroom materials for parent review.</p>								

How will a parent learn about my child's progress in school or with a class?

How can I support my student's learning?

Campus Learning (BCS's learning management system) is available for families to engage and monitor their student's learning progress, including grades. Teachers will also post important messages to families about expectations and upcoming assignments utilizing the tool. The school utilizes ParentSquare and the student version, StudentSquare, to communicate with families. This tool allows for communication from the teacher to entire classes or groups and allows for parents or students to individually communicate with teachers directly. Additionally, by partnering with the school on the following learning habits, students will be best set up to be successful.

Establish a Consistent Routine:

Create a daily schedule that includes dedicated time for homework, reading, and other learning activities. Consistency helps children feel secure and develop good study habits.

Create a Quiet and Organized Study Space:

Designate a quiet area where your child can focus on their schoolwork without distractions. Keep essential supplies, such as pens, pencils, and notebooks, readily available.

Encourage Regular Reading:

Foster a love for reading by providing a variety of age-appropriate books. Set aside time for family reading, and discuss the stories with your child to enhance comprehension and critical thinking skills.

Engage in Conversations:

Regularly talk with your child about their school day. Ask open-ended questions to encourage them to share their experiences, challenges, and successes. This helps build strong communication skills.

Support Homework Efforts:

Be available to assist with homework when needed. Offer guidance, but allow your child to work independently as much as possible. This helps build self-confidence and problem-solving skills.

Embrace Technology as a Learning Tool, but Cultivate Balance:

Utilize educational apps, online resources, and interactive tools to enhance your child's learning experience. Be involved in exploring these tools together.

Promote a Healthy Lifestyle:

Encourage regular exercise, a balanced diet, and adequate sleep. Physical well-being directly impacts cognitive function and concentration.

Partner with Teachers:

Stay informed about your child's progress by tuning in to teacher communications. Reach out to teachers when you have a concern. Support the teacher when the teacher reaches out regarding behavioral or academic concerns.

Foster a Growth Mindset:

Encourage a positive attitude toward challenges and learning from mistakes. Emphasize the importance of perseverance and resilience in the face of difficulties.

Cultivate Curiosity:

Explore your child's interests and engage in activities that spark their curiosity. This helps create a passion for learning and broadens their educational horizons.

<p>What are the qualifications of my child's teachers?</p>	<p>The State of North Carolina requires charter schools to have more than 50% of teachers certified in grades 6-12. To become a certified teacher, individuals typically need to meet certain qualifications and follow a set of steps. Please note that certification requirements may change, and it's always a good idea to check with the North Carolina Department of Public Instruction (NCDPI) for the most up-to-date information.</p> <p>Education Requirements:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Earn a bachelor's degree from an accredited institution. The degree should be related to the subject area or grade level the individual intends to teach. <p>Teacher Preparation Program:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Complete an approved teacher preparation program. This program is often part of the bachelor's degree in education. <p>Student Teaching Experience:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Gain practical classroom experience through student teaching. This is typically a required component of the teacher preparation program. <p>Testing Requirements:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Pass the required exams. In North Carolina, this often includes the Praxis Core Academic Skills for Educators (CORE) tests and specific Praxis Subject Assessments for the desired teaching area. <p>Background Check:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Undergo a criminal background check. A clean background is usually a requirement for teacher certification. <p>At BCS, more than 80% of our staff is certified and others are working towards that certification. All core teachers have a minimum of a four year degree and experience that relates to teaching.</p>
<p>What are the requirements for school enrollment?</p>	<p>As mandated by our Charter from the State of North Carolina, open slots are filled through a lottery. Any applications received after the lottery application deadline (February 28th) will be placed at the end of the waitlist of the grade applied, in the order of receipt. Applications are not accepted and new students will not be admitted after October 1st. Once a child is accepted through the lottery process, they will receive a communication from the school about registration (birth certificate, two proofs of residency, immunization, school documents (EOG/EOC, grades, etc.) and any special education information, if applicable.)</p>
<p>How can a parent help their child develop citizenship, social skills and respect for others?</p>	<p>We believe that education extends beyond academics, and as partners in your child's growth, we are committed to fostering not only intellectual development but also essential life & durable skills.
